Wohlsen Construction Company Receives National Award

Wohlsen Construction Company received a National Pyramid Award from Associated Builders and Contractors (ABC) at the association's legislative conference in Washington, DC. Wohlsen was the only Lancaster County firm to receive an award in the year's National Excellence in Construction Competition.

Wohlsen was recognized in the Healthcare \$5 - 10 million category for the James Street Entrance and Facade project at Lancaster General Hospital, located in Lancaster, Pa.

The 25,000 square foot, 5-story facility was constructed on the Hospital's busy, occupied healthcare campus in downtown Lancaster and serves as the main entrance to the hospital. Tim Elder of Manheim, Pa. served as Wohlsen's project manager and Bill Musser of Willow Street, Pa. served as superintendent. IKM, Inc. was the project's architect.



The national awards program is designed to recognize publicly the quality and innovation of merit shop construction and to honor all the members of the construction team, including the contractor, the owner and the design team responsible for the project. The winning projects were selected from entries throughout the country and were judged on complexity, attractiveness, unusual challenges, completion time, workmanship, innovation, safety, and budget.
