## WOHLSSEN CONSTRUCTION COMPANY RECEIVES NINE AWARDS

Wohlsen Construction Company received nine awards from the Keystone Chapter of Associated Builders and Contractors (ABC) at the association's recent 20<sup>th</sup> Annual Excellence in Construction Awards Gala.

The Klehr Center for Jewish life at Franklin and Marshall College received a first place Award of Excellence. The award was received in the Institutional Under \$2 million category.

An Award of Excellence in the Institutional \$2 – 10 million category was received for the Education and Youth Ministries Wings Addition at Calvary Church, located in Lancaster, PA.

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The Reading Hospital and Medical Center Labor, Delivery, and Recovery Obstetrics Upgrade project received an award of merit in the Medical Renovation Under \$1 million category.

The Millmont Elementary School project for the Reading Area School District received an award of merit in the Institutional \$10 - 25 million category.

Wohlsen's fourth award of merit was received in the Institutional \$2 – 10 million category for the construction of the Bonchek College House project located on the Campus of Franklin & Marshall College.
